

Council fell over two hurdles in pilot initiative

WATERFORD City & County Council failed to meet the minimum criteria in two sections of their application for a Night Time Economy Advisor, the Waterford News & Star understands.

According to feedback given to the Council from the Local Government Management Agency, the Council failed to sufficiently

demonstrate "a willingness to develop a broad Night Time Economy offering, including recreational, cultural, and commercial offerings, across a range of timespans and catering for a diverse range of stakeholder groups". They also failed to sufficiently demonstrate "a commitment to a wide-ranging consultation/engagement process with new and exist-

ing stakeholders in the city or town".

The Waterford News & Star has seen Waterford City & County Council's application for the Night Time Economy Advisor pilot programme, which was certainly robust in length at 3764 words.

Nineteen venues to benefit from night time funding

THANKFULLY there has been some good news for Waterford's Night Time economy with the announcement that 19 City and County bars, restaurants and a church were successful in receiving funding from the Night-Time Economy Support Scheme.

The successful applicants were The Strand Inn, Project & Electric Avenue, The Lady Belle, The Riverside Cottage, T&H Doolans, The Reg, The Uluru Outback Bar & Restaurant, Cliff House Hotel/ Urchin Bar, Bodega Restaurant, Kazbar, Jarrz, The Classroom Bar, The Factory Nightclub, Downey's Bar, The Craftsman, One The



Waterfront, Waterford Castle Resort, Dooley's Hotel and Christ Church Cathedral.

The funding is designed to assist in the provision of off-peak entertainment providing 75 per cent of the

required funding for the late night entertainment offering, with applicants required to fund the remaining 25 per cent. A maximum allowable grant of €10,000 per business or venue was available.

Drogheda and Bunclara to compare and see how they cleared the hurdles that were seemingly too high for Waterford City & County Council

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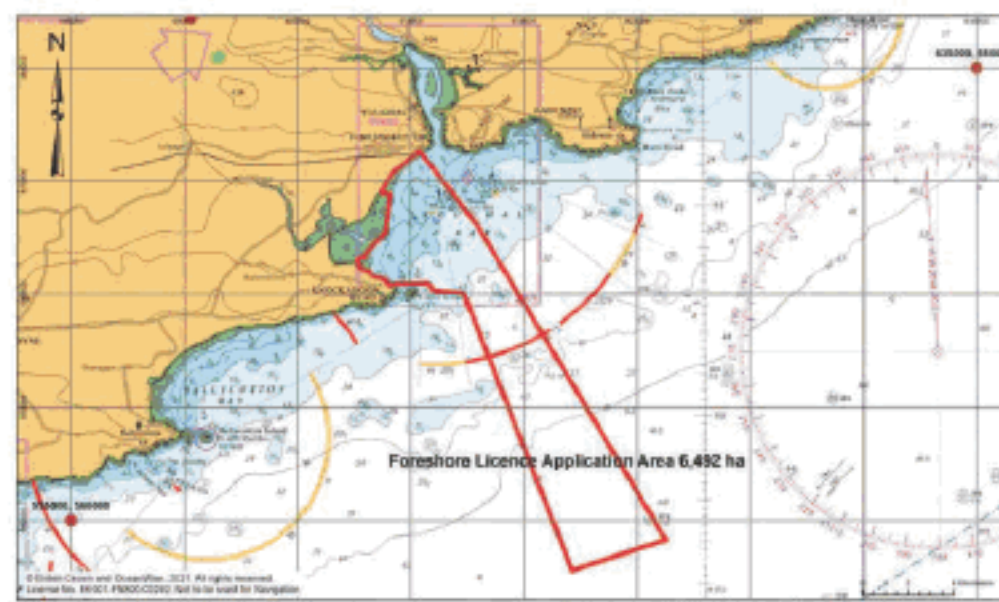

PUBLIC NOTICE

INVITATION FOR PUBLIC SUBMISSIONS OR OBSERVATIONS ON APPROPRIATE ASSESSMENT

Notice is hereby given pursuant to Regulation 42(13) of the European Communities (Birds and Natural Habitats) Regulations 2011, as amended, of an application for Foreshore Licence (reference number FS007404) submitted by Inis Ealga Marine Energy Park Ltd. in relation to an offshore wind farm and associated export cable route under development off the coast of county Cork.

This application is for site investigations to inform engineering and design related to a potential offshore wind farm, Inis Ealga Marine Energy Park. The objective of the site investigations is to gather sufficient geophysical, geotechnical, environmental, archaeological and ecological information to inform development of export cable route within the Foreshore Licence Application Area. The Foreshore Licence Application Area is shown on the map below. The Minister for Housing, Local Government and Heritage is responsible for making a decision on the



application and the Minister may either grant, approve or consent to the application with or without covenants, conditions or agreements, where applicable, or refuse the application.

The Minister has determined, in accordance with Regulation 42(6) of the European Communities (Birds and Natural Habitats) Regulations 2011, that an Appropriate Assessment is required in respect of the proposed plan or project. A copy of the Screening for Appropriate Assessment is available on:

The Minister will make a determination as to whether or not the proposed plan or project would adversely affect the integrity of a European site in accordance with Regulation 42(11) of the European Communities (Birds and Natural Habitats) Regulations 2011 and, in doing so, shall have regard to the matters in Regulation 42(12).

In this regard, in accordance with Regulation 42(13), any person may make a submission or observation to the Minister concerning the proposed project within 30 days of the date of this notice. The Minister shall have regard to any submissions or observations received during the public consultation.

A copy of the application, map of the proposed project, the determination that an Appropriate Assessment is required in respect of the project, the Natura Impact Statement, and the other information and documentation relevant to the application, are available for inspection for 30 calendar days, between 10 November 2022 and 09 December 2022, free of charge at:
